The Algonquins of Ontario (AOO), made up of ten communities, are engaged in discussions with the Governments of Canada and Ontario to develop a modern-day Treaty in Algonquin Traditional Territory. In addition to these negotiations, the AOO have also been making concerted efforts to protect and preserve Algonquin heritage resources. These resources represent the physical and spiritual manifestation of ancestral ways of life, traditional values and knowledge of the AOO. It is critically important that these resources be protected to preserve AOO history and traditions, while honouring and fostering pride in Algonquin identity and culture and also promoting awareness and education about the Algonquin people for future generations.

In support of this endeavor, the AOO are currently seeking an experienced, progressive and dynamic **Heritage and Cultural Planner**. The Heritage and Cultural Planner will be responsible for the planning, development and implementation of cultural and heritage programs, activities and priorities of the AOO. The Heritage and Cultural Planner will provide a wide-range of strategic and operational services to develop the capacity to support the inventory, stewardship and conservation of these heritage resources.

The ideal candidate will possess a Degree in Heritage and Culture, Archaeology or equivalent, with experience in First Nation cultural heritage resource management. An equivalent combination of postsecondary schooling, training/workshops combined with considerable experience in cultural heritage resource management will also be considered. Experience providing advice on cultural heritage management issues with the ability to handle politically sensitive matters as well as analyze, identify and recommend options for senior management and leadership is essential. Candidates must have strong analytical, research, computer and interview skills, and possess a strong knowledge of artifact preservation and management.
